s in most recent years, Munich's traditional summer Opera Festival in 2023 will offer an undeniable plethora of seven varied perfor- Anja Harteros mances (taking us into three of the cities beau-

tiful opera theatres) within a compact **seven-night period**. Reflecting the imaginative range of the repertoire and the superlative casting, our July week promises to be the highlight of Europe's summer offerings. Our program will include four major operas - Handel's richly melodic Semele, Mozart's lyric comedy Così fan Tutte, Wagner's psychological music-drama

Lohengrin, and Richard Strauss's emotionally shattering Salome. (All operas are in the original language with English surtitles.) Several additional evenings will offer a Recital by Munich's star soprano Anja Harteros; a Piano Recital by the Russian-German sensation Igor Levit; and an evening of Chamber Music in the Rococo Cuvilliés-Theater.

Wednesday, July 12th, departure from New York's Kennedy Airport at 5:25 pm on Lufthansa flight #411, scheduled to arrive in Munich at 7:30 am on the 13th. Or independent travel to Munich.



At 8:00 pm on Thursday, a short walk will take us to Munich's Nationaltheater for the sold-out **Recital** by Anja Harteros. A great favorite in Munich, Harteros has earned an enviable reputation for her operatic portrayals in the works of Verdi, Giordano,

Wagner and Strauss. Her annual Festival Recitals are always a cause for celebration. Program and accompanist To Be Announced.

Friday afternoon, July 14th, a two-hour walking tour will introduce you to the historical center of Munich, encompassing the

Gothic Frauenkirche ('Church of our Lady'), the Hofbrauhaus, Odensplatz with the Field Marshall's Hall, and the Residenzplatz. Our walk will conclude with a stop at the Café Luitpold for the German tradition of afternoon coffee and cake.


At 8:00 pm on Friday evening, we will return to the National Theater for a performance of Richard Strauss's Salome. The text is taken almost word-for-word from Oscar Wilde's shocking eponymous play, culminating in the celebrated

Dance of the Seven Veils and the soprano's challenging Final Scene. Strauss's ground-breaking score will be conducted by Mikko Franck, and the staging is a revival of the 2019 production by the Polish team of director Krzystof Warlikowski and set designer Malgorzata Szczesniak. The title role will be sung by Finnish soprano Camilla Nylund, with Wolfgang Koch as John the Baptist, Gerhard Siegel as Herod, and Waltraud Meier as Herodias. Sung in German.

Saturday, July 15th, is left free during the day for independent activities. During our several free mornings and afternoons, you should spend some time strolling through the woods and fields of the spacious English Garden, where the local population enjoys nude swimming and sunbathing along the fast-running waters of the Isar River. Also not to be missed are the Alte Pinakothek's priceless collection of European masters, re-opened in 1998 after extensive renovation; the Neue **Pinakothek**. in a modern circular gallery of unusual architectural beauty; and the Glyptothek museum of classical antiquities. Early Saturday evening, we are fortunate to attend the 6:00 pm performance of George Frideric Handel's 18th century Baroque opera, Semele. This will be the Premiere of the New Co-Production with the MET Opera, at Munich's historic Prinzregenten Theater. With a witty libretto taken from a text by William Congreve,

'Semele' is among Handel's finest accomplishments, with such familiar arias as 'Where 'er you walk', 'Myself I shall adore', 'Despair no more shall wound me', and 'O Sleep, why dost thou

leave me'. Conductor Stefano Montanari will lead a cast including Brenda Rae as Salome, Michael Spyres as Jupiter, Jakub Josef Orlinski as Athanas, and Emily D'Angelo as Juno. The director is Claus Guth, and the scenery is designed by Michael Levine. Sung in English.

and Johan Reuter as Friedrich von Telramund. The director is Kornei Mundrucz, and the set designer is Monika Pormale. Premiered in 1850, 'Lohengrin' is the most Italianate of Wagner's music-dramas and continues to be a corner-stone of Munich's repertoire. Sung in German.

Monday morning, July 17th, a guided visit is planned through the private state apartments of the Alte Residenz, the palatial former home of the Wittelsbach rulers only a few short blocks from our hotel. The original Renaissance structure has been expanded many times and now houses a vast collection off German decorative arts and paintings.

At 7:00 pm on Monday, our opera in the National Theater will be Mozart's peerless comedy, Così fan Tutte. Inspired by his librettist Lorenzo da Ponte, Mozart's consummate score unfolds in a seamless stream of brilliant arias and duets. Under the baton of conductor Vladimir Jurowski, the cast includes Louise



Alder and Avery Amereau as the fickle sisters Fiordiligi and Dorabella, Konstantin Krimmel and Sebastian Kohlhepp as their disillusioned suitors Guglielmo and Ferrando, and Sandrine Piau aside Johannes Martin Kränzle as the worldlywise protagonists Despina and Don Alfonso. The production by director **Benedict** Andrews and designer Magda Willi was

unveiled only last year. Sung in Italian.

On Tuesday, July 18th, an excursion is planned into the lakecountry to the Southwest of Munich. About an hour from the

city, Lake Starnberger is bordered by grand villas and gardens and is widely known as the site of 'Mad' King Ludwig's drowning. We will visit the lakefront Buchheim Museum containing -a priceless collection of Blauer Reiter paintings (Kandinsky, Gabriele Munter, Franz Marc) before an outdoor lunch at the nearby Klostergasthof Andechs. A short walk uphill will take us inside the Benedictine Andechs Abbey, a fine example of

17th century Baroque architecture, before returning to the hotel in the late afternoon.

Tuesday evening, we will attend the 8:00 pm Piano Recital by the Russian-German virtuoso Igor Levit, revered throughout the music world as one of the "most important artists of his generation" (NY Times). The concert will be in the National Theater.
